

The American Antiquarian Society is delighted to announce that it will be offering three new short-term fellowships for the 2012-13 academic year. These fellowships have been made possible thanks to the generosity of Justin G. Schiller, Linda and Julian Lapidés, and the Ralph Waldo Emerson Society.

All of the fellowships offer one month of support for scholars to do research in the AAS collections, with a stipend of \$1,850. The application deadline is **January 15, 2012**. Further details and application materials are available at <http://www.americanantiquarian.org/acafellowship.htm> .

- **Barbara L. Packer Fellowship** The Barbara L. Packer Fellowship, established by the Ralph Waldo Emerson Society to honor the memory of Barbara Packer, is awarded to individuals engaged in scholarly research and writing related to the Transcendentalists in general, and most especially to Ralph Waldo Emerson, Margaret Fuller, and Henry David Thoreau. It is open to both postdoctoral scholars and graduate students at work on doctoral dissertations.

- **Linda F. & Julian L. Lapidés Fellowship** The Linda F. & Julian L. Lapidés Fellowship supports research on printed and manuscript material produced in America through 1865 for (or by) children and youth. The Lapidés Fellowship will support projects examining the creative, artistic, cultural, technological, or commercial aspects of American juvenile literature and ephemera produced between the Puritan Era and the Civil War. It is open to both postdoctoral scholars and graduate students at work on doctoral dissertations.

- **Justin G. Schiller Fellowship** The Justin G. Schiller Fellowship supports research by both doctoral candidates and postdoctoral scholars from any disciplinary perspective on the production, distribution, literary content, or historical context of American children's books to 1876.
