Dr. Michael A. North

(University of California, Los Angeles)

Michael A. North has been Professor of English at the University of California, Los Angeles since 1991 and specializes in twentieth-century British and American Literature. Professor North has written five books, including *The Dialect of Modernism: Race, Language, and Twentieth-Century Literature* (1994) and *Reading 1922: A Return to the Scene of the Modern* (1999), and is also editor of the Norton Critical Edition of *The Waste Land*. His honors include a UC President's Research fellowship and a Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellowship. He will be sharing his work from an upcoming publication, soon to appear in *PMLA*, entitled "The Picture of Oscar Wilde: Public Tragedy and the Status of Art."
