Cal State L.A.'s School of Health and Human Services is committed to addressing critical urban issues within an interdisciplinary and multicultural framework that respects and promotes the integration of teaching, research and public service. The faculty prepare both undergraduate and graduate students to assume positions that will contribute to the health and wellness of children, adults, families and communities. Health is defined within this school as a multi-faceted concept that includes physical, spiritual, biological, psychological, and socioeconomic components. Each program has a unique approach to human services while also addressing this broad concept of health and safety, physical education, social work and speech-language pathology.

With more than 60 full-time and numerous part-time faculty, plus 29 staff members, the School serves approximately 4,000 undergraduate and graduate majors in academics within the departments of Child and Family Studies, Communication Disorders, Criminal Justice, Health and Nutritional Sciences, Nursing, Kinesiology and Physical Education, and Social Work. The School is also home to the Edward R. Roybal Institute for Applied Gerontology, American Humanics, Inc., (a program in Youth Agency Administration), the Institute for Nursing, and the Child Abuse and Family Violence Institute.
