1.1.2 Following is the response from Vice President Ross to the questions raised at the Senate meeting on April 17, 2007:

Question:

What is the University procedure for "bumping" scheduled courses out of classrooms? Who makes this determination and what measures exist to ensure that "bumped" classes are assigned to classrooms appropriate for their instructional needs?

Response:

The decision to move a course section whose enrollment has exceeded the capacity of the assigned classroom is made by the Scheduling Office in the Office of the Registrar.

All initial scheduling assignments are made by the College Scheduler (of each academic college) and submitted to the Scheduling Office. Once the quarter has begun and it has been determined that a course section has exceeded the room capacity then the necessary adjustments must be made. When this occurs classrooms are switched based on enrollment of the course sections. Every effort is made to ensure that the course section being moved out as well as the course section being moved in are going to classrooms appropriate for their instructional needs.

The Scheduling Office contacts both departments involved in the change of classrooms and works with both departments to ensure that all needs are met.

I trust this answers Senator Moss' question.
