Campus Health Requirements

Measles and Rubella and (M/R) Immunizations

Students born after January 1, 1957, are required to present proof* of measles and rubella immunizations. Students born in 1982 or later (1983, 1984, etc.) who were enrolled in a California public school will have satisfied this requirement (you will not need to bring proof of immunization to the Student Health Center). *Students will not be able to register for a second quarter until this requirement has been completed.*

*Acceptable proof is a written document, such as an immunization card, signed and dated by a licensed health care provider or photocopies of high school immunization records.

Hepatitis B Immunizations

All new students 18 years of age and younger must be required to present written proof* of immunizations against hepatitis B. Immunization consists of a series of three injections. Students born in 1982 or later (1983, 1984, etc.) who were enrolled in a California public school will have satisfied this requirement (you will not need to bring proof of immunization to the Student Health Center). *Students will not be able to register for a second quarter until this requirement has been completed.*

*Acceptable proof is a written document, such as an immunization card, signed and dated by a licensed health care provider or photocopies of high school immunization records.

Meningococcal Vaccine

All freshman who will be residing in on-campus housing are required to return to the campus a response form indicating that they have received meningococcal disease information; chosen whether or not to receive the vaccination; and sign and return the form to the campus Student Health Center or Housing. (Housing Services will provide you with this form at sign-in.)

Tuberculosis

All new and returning international students and students who will be living in on-campus housing for the first time must provide acceptable proof of a negative TB skin test or chest x-ray taken within the past year. (Housing Services and International Program and Services Office will provide you with this form.)

The Student Health Center offers TB skin tests and chest x-rays at no cost; Hepatitis B immunizations are free of cost to students 18 years of age and younger. Measles/Rubella immunizations are offered at a discounted cost. Questions? Call the Student Health Center information line at (323) 343-3300.

KEEPING RECORDS

In order to fulfill your responsibility for planning your education, you should assemble and keep up-to-date an academic portfolio containing the following:

- A list of courses you have taken so you can follow your progress toward your objectives.
- Transcripts from all schools you have attended and all letters and forms you have received from the Cal State L.A. Admissions Office.
- All Cal State L.A. grade reports.
- Test results from entrance exams, language exams, English and math proficiency and placement exams, and advanced placement exams.
- Copies of important communications to and from the University such as *change of major* and *academic petition* forms, your *graduation check*, and *receipts for all financial transactions*.
- Names and addresses of advisers, faculty references, and other people on campus with whom you have frequent contact.

QUARTERLY GRADE REPORTS

Students may view quarterly grade results approximately 5 working days after the last final examination is given for the term.
