Active conductor, scholar, clinician, and adjudicator, Dr. Sébastien Vallée is one of the nation's leading new figures in the world of choral music. Dr. Vallée is Director of Choral

Studies at California State University, Los Angeles where he teaches conducting at both the undergraduate and graduate levels in addition to conducting the University's three choral ensembles.

In addition to his interest in choral, operatic, and orchestra music, Vallée is an advocate of contemporary music, making one of his priorities to premiere and commission works by young composers and program rarely performed repertoire.

Dr. Vallée is also Founder and Director of the Redlands Choral Artists, Musical and Artistic Director of the Mountainside Master Chorale, and Music Director at Glendale City Church. Dr. Vallée will teach choral conducting, choral seminar, graduate choral ensemble, and applied conducting.

Donald Brinegar is Professor of Music and Director of Choral and Vocal Activities at Pasadena City College, visiting Professor of Choral Music at the University of

He directs the Donald Brinegar Singers, in Pasadena, which performed at Western Division and ACDA conventions, and recorded for Koch International, RCM, and Walton Record labels. Mr. Brinegar will teach choral conducting, applied voice, choral seminar, graduate choral ensemble, and applied conducting.

Three-Summer Master of Music IN CHORAL CONDUCTING



Earn your Master of Music in Choral Conducting through an intense three-summer program in Los Angeles – the perfect scheduling solution for teachers and busy professionals. This unique program will allow you to refine your conducting and rehearsal technique, musicianship, and vocal pedagogy with hands-on attention of prestigious and experienced faculty.

Each summer residency is seven weeks long and includes a one-week choral festival of lectures, master classes, and performances with prominent guest artists. The Summer Master of Music is offered in special sessions through the College of Extended Studies and International Programs and is managed through the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance.

The program also allows you to transfer up to three regular-session classes (12 quarter units or equivalent) from an accredited university of your choice.

The Summer Master of Music is the same degree as the one offered by the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance during regular session, and is fully accredited through the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM).

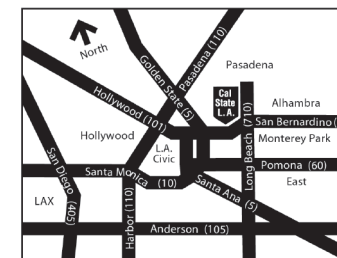
WPE/GWAR
