



International Ambassador Program

The International Office is looking for friendly, responsible and enthusiastic students to help in the International Student Orientation and assist the new students in their adjustment to the U.S. and Los Angeles. Under the supervision and guidance of the Immigration Counselor, you will be assisting in the following areas:

1. Peer advising to international students
 - a. Meet and welcome new international students and provide general assistance in navigating the campus
 - b. Guide new students through GET and how to enroll in classes
 - c. Assist the International Office in completing new files (make photocopies during student check-in)
2. Assist with the International Student Orientation
 - a. Registration of attendees
 - b. Facilitator of small group discussions during the Orientation
 - c. Lead ice-breaker activities
3. Participate in International Office programs that promote increased cultural awareness and interactions among international and U.S. students. Activities include:
 - a. Global Coffee Break
 - b. International Education Week
 - c. International Day of Dance
4. Orientation Leaders **must** be available for the International Student Orientation for the term of service.

Volunteer Hours

Fall Quarter

This volunteer position is expected to start last week of August and continue during Fall Quarter. International Ambassadors are expected to complete at least 20 hours of service. Orientation Leaders are expected to complete at least 30 hours of service and participate in the Fall International Student Orientation.

Winter Quarter

This volunteer position is expected to start mid-December after finals and continue during Winter Quarter. International Ambassadors are expected to complete at least 20 hours of service. Orientation Leaders are expected to complete at least 30 hours of service and participate in the Winter International Student Orientation.

Spring Quarter

This volunteer position is expected to start with Spring Break and continue during Spring Quarter. International Ambassadors are expected to complete at least 20 hours of service. Orientation Leaders are expected to complete at least 30 hours of service and participate in the Spring International Student Orientation.

2. Must be in good academic standing (Not under academic probation or GPA disqualification)
3. Good team player and willing to help others
4. Highly motivated and enthusiastic
