Eligibility Standards for Current Cal State L.A. Technology Students

An undergraduate who has completed at least 45 quarter units (at least 24 units in their major), are in the upper 35% of undergraduates in their program, and must have earned a major grade point average (g.p.a.) of at least 3.25 or a transfer student with an Associate Degree from an articulated program with an approved associates degree in technology with a g.p.a. of at least 3.25. [Students who entered Cal State L.A. through another path should consult Dr. Lipton for specific requirements.]

A graduate student admitted to an approved advanced degree program may be considered after completing at least 9 semester hours or 12-quarter hours in the program with at least a 3.3 cumulative grade point average in courses prescribed for the degree.

Faculty, Professionals, Alumni, and Supporters of technology programs are also eligible for membership.
