The Master of Arts degree in Educational Foundations is an interdisciplinary academic program, which draws on conceptual frameworks and methodologies from the humanities, social sciences, and behavioral science. This degree program, is designed to prepare teachers and other educational professionals (e.g. counselors, higher education professionals, administrators, and other educators working in schools, government, business, or civic agencies) to understand and respond to the social contexts that give meaning to education both in and out of schools. Coursework is offered in history of education, educational sociology, policy studies in education, queer studies in education, anthropology of education, educational psychology and human development. This coursework provides students with opportunities to acquire interpretive, normative, and critical perspectives on education through rigorous study and research experience.

REQUIREMENT FOR THE DEGREE (33 UNITS)

A minimum of 17 of the 33 units must be in 5000-level courses and at least 17 units must consist of education courses. Refer to course description of variable unit course for restrictions on credit limit.
