Installment Payment Plan (IPP) - 3 Payments

Defer the cost of your Tuition Fee for an enrollment fee of \$33.00. The first installment is due prior to registration, the second installment is due 30 days from the issued agreement date and the 3rd installment is due 60 days from the issued agreement date.

Available from October 3rd, 2016 through December 3rd, 2016

Management Payment Plan (MPP) - 4 Payments

Divide the cost of your tuition and fees into four installments for an enrollment fee of \$35.00 for one term. The first payment for spring 2017 term is due November 1st, 2016. *If your enrollment appointment is earlier than November 1st, then the first payment is required to register for classes.* The last day to use this plan for spring 2017 is December 1st, 2016, however both the November and December payments must be made to enroll at that time.
