- 7. 7.1 It was m/s/ (Selke) to postpone the resolution indefinitely.
 - 7.2 Discussion ensued.
 - 7.3 It was m/s/p (Selke) to withdraw the motion to postpone indefinitely.
 - 7.4 It was m/s/ (Zepeda) to amend document 03-10 as follows: in the third Whereas clause, insert the phrase OR AN ACADEMIC PRESS after the word "journal" and delete the words an article; in the fourth Whereas clause, insert the phrase AND ACADEMIC PRESSES after the word "journals," delete the phrase <u>published by the American Chemical Society and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers</u>, and delete the word <u>articles</u> and insert the word MANUSCRIPTS; and in the fourth Resolved clause, delete the phrase <u>the American Chemical Society</u>, the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers, and.
 - 7.5 Senator Cleman suggested as an editorial amendment that the amendment to the fourth Whereas clause include deleting the words <u>are being</u> and inserting the words HAVE BEEN.
 - 7.6 It was agreed by consensus that the suggestion made by Senator Cleman be considered an editorial amendment.
 - 7.7 The amendment was approved as amended.
 - 7.8 The resolution was APPROVED as amended (03-10). Copies of the document are available in the Senate Office.
- 8. 8.1 Senator Vargas distributed document 03-11.1 to the Senate.
 - 8.2 It was m/s/p (Vargas) to substitute document 03-11.1 for document 03-11.
 - 8.3 It was m/s/f (Davis) to amend the first Resolved clause in document 03-11.1 by deleting the phrase <u>cease price gauging</u> and inserting the phrase LIMIT PRICE INCREASES TO NO MORE THAN THE INCREASES IN THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX.
 - 8.4 It was m/s/p (Vargas) to amend the first Resolved clause in document 03-11.1 by deleting the phrase <u>cease price gauging and</u>.
 - 8.5 It was m/s/p (Hunt) to amend the second item in the first Resolved clause by deleting the phrase <u>bells and whistles</u> and inserting the phrase SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS.
 - 8.6 It was m/s/ (Whitcomb) to amend the first item in the first Resolved clause by deleting the word <u>cost</u> and inserting the word PRICE.

- 8.8 It was agreed by consensus to consider the Whitcomb amendment as editorial.
- 8.9 Senator Cates suggested and the body agreed that in the last Whereas clause the word OF should be inserted after the word "advantage."
- 8.10 It was m/s/p (Taiz) to table the resolution (03-11.1) to allow the Student Senators time to redraft the resolution based on the discussion.
- 9. 9.1 It was m/s/p (Koch) to amend document 03-12 by deleting the fourth bullet in the last Whereas clause and moving the phrase "therefore be it" to the end of the third bullet.
 - 9.2 It was m/s/ (Taiz) to amend document 03-12 by inserting a new fourth bullet in the last Whereas clause that reads: CSULA'S INSTITUTES MAKE IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE LOS ANGELES COMMUNITY.
 - 9.3 Senator Cardoza suggested that the Taiz motion be amended to include the words CENTER AND before the word "institutes.
 - 9.4 It was agreed by consensus to accept the suggestion made by Senator Cardoza as editorial.
 - 9.5 The Taiz motion failed.
 - 9.6 It was m/s/ (Gutierrez) to amend the third Whereas clause in document 03-12 by deleting the word <u>affect</u>, inserting the word REDUCE before the word "drastically," and inserting the word HIGH before the word "quality."
 - 9.7 It was agreed by consensus to accept the Gutierrez amendment as editorial.
 - 9.8 It was m/s/ (Dewey) to amend the last Whereas clause in document 03-12 by deleting the phrase <u>directly affect our own</u> and inserting the phrase THAT OF THE.
 - 9.9 Senator Herr suggested that the Dewey amendment be changed to WILL DIRECTLY AFFECT THE.
 - 9.10It was agreed by consensus to accept the Herr amendment to the last Whereas clause as editorial.
 - 9.11It was m/s/ (Taylor) to amend the third bullet of the last Whereas clause in document 02-13 by deleting 12,621 full-time.
 - 9.12It was agreed by consensus to accept the Taylor amendment as editorial.
 - 9.13It was m/s/p (Cates) to close debate on the resolution.
