(39 Lower Division, 9 Upper Division units)</li> <li>• An Introduction to Higher Education course (IHE) is required of all first-time freshmen.</li> <li>• A minimum C grade in A1, A2, A3, and B4 classes is required. A 'C-' grade is not acceptable.</li> <li>• A minimum C grade average in general education is required.</li> <li>• Students must pass the Writing Proficiency Exam (WPE).</li> <li>• Civic Learning/Community Engagement Requirement (6 semester units). One (cl) course must be completed at the upper division general education level. These courses are designated as (cl) after the course listing.</li> <li>• Diversity Requirement (6 semester units). Students must complete one race/ethnicity (re) course and one diversity (d) course or another race/ethnicity (re) course. These courses are designated as (re) and (d) after the course listing.</li> <li>• Writing Intensive Requirement (6 semester units). Students must complete two writing intensive (wi) courses, with at least one in their major. These courses are designated as (wi) after the course listing.</li> </ul>
