## 1 Retired Faculty - Emeritus Status

- 5 The University appreciates the past services of its retired faculty and encourages their
- 6 participation in the life of the University community. In this spirit, it extends to all faculty
- 7 retirees the following courtesies: access to INFORMATION and guidance concerning pertinent
- 8 retirement benefits <u>information</u>; library privileges; inclusion in the campus DIRECTORY
- 9 <u>telephone and internet based directories</u> (unless declined); notification of all important
- 10 developments or changes affecting their interests or relations with the University or with the
- 11 State University system; invitations to participate in all commencements, public ceremonies, and
- 12 convocations on the same basis as active faculty members; and invitations to participate in
- 13 appropriate seminars, colloquia, lectures, and other scholarly meetings, both as contributors and
- 14 as audience.

## 15 Emeritus Status

- 16 Upon the recommendation of the candidate's department/division/school and college dean and
- 17 <u>with the approval of the President, eEmeritus</u> status may be granted to a tenured faculty member
- 18 who has resigned/retired after a minimum of ten (10) years of distinguished service at California
- 19 State University, Los Angeles.
- 20 Faculty granted Emeritus status shall enjoy all the courtesies accorded retired faculty plus the
- 21 following benefits: inclusion at the head of the corresponding department's/division's/school's
- 22 faculty list, as well as in the consolidated Emeriti list in the General Catalog; recommendation
- 23 for life membership in the Alumni Association; a special identification card; receipt by mail of
- 24 copies of the University Reports, Calendar of Events, and similar informational publications OF
- 25 PUBLICATIONS AND INFORMATION RELATED TO UNIVERSITY ACTIVITIES (unless
- declined); selective invitation to participate in campus councils as consultants, where appropriate
- and legal; free admission to musical, dramatic, athletic and other University performances;
- 28 access to electronic communication and information as long as they are legally and fiscally
- 29 feasible; faculty library borrowing privileges; access to campus rooms and facilities for meetings 20 and rounions of Emeritic and a faculty parking permit and office appear on a space available basis
- 30 and reunions of Emeriti; and a faculty parking permit and office space on a space available basis.
- 31 **Criteria.** It is expected that a faculty member will have at least ten uninterrupted years of
- 32 distinguished service AS A TEACHER AND SCHOLAR, AND WILL HAVE MADE
- 33 SIGNIFICANT contributions at TO California State University, Los Angeles, prior to
- 34 resignation/retirement in order to qualify as a candidate for Emeritus status, although exceptions
- 35 may be made for faculty with fewer years of service who have made <u>outstanding</u>
- 36 EXCEPTIONAL contributions AS IDENTIFIED BY THEIR FACULTY COLLEAGUES. The
- 37 successful candidate for Emeritus status will have maintained an instructional and professional
- 38 profile that demonstrates a high level of achievement. In addition, the candidate is expected to
- 39 <u>have made significant contributions to the University.</u>

- 40 Approval. All tenured faculty who resign/retire <u>and who</u> MAY request Emeritus status. <u>must be</u>
- 41 <u>considered for it by t</u>The appropriate department<u>al</u>/division<u>al</u>/school committee and the college
- 42 dean MUST EACH MAKE A RECOMMENDATION PRIOR TO THE CONSIDERATION BY
- 43 THE PRESIDENT. The procedure for consideration of Emeritus status <u>may</u> MUST be initiated
- 44 by <u>either</u> the faculty member<u>or the faculty member's department/division/school, preferably two</u>
- 45 <u>quarters before</u> WITHIN TWO YEARS FOLLOWING the effective date of
- 46 retirement/resignation. FOR THOSE IN THE FACULTY EARLY RETIREMENT PROGRAM
- 47 (FERP), THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF RETIREMENT IS PRIOR TO ENTERING FERP
- 48 STATUS. To be considered for Emeritus status, resigning/retiring faculty members must submit
- 49 an updated curriculum vitae, <u>and are strongly encouraged to submit a</u> photograph, and brief
- 50 biography. Departments/divisions/schools are expected to forward their recommendations on
- 51 Emeritus status in a timely manner (preferably one quarter prior to the effective
- 52 resignation/retirement date but not later than the second quarter following
- 53 <u>resignation/retirement).</u> The recommendations of the department/division/school committee and
- 54 the college dean shall be forwarded <u>in a timely manner</u> to the Provost <u>and Vice President for</u>
- 55 <u>Academic Affairs</u> and the President along with the <u>candidates' personnel files</u> PERSONNEL
- 56 ACTION FILE for final consideration and approval. The President will inform the faculty
- 57 member of the final decision.
- 58 POSTHUMOUS NOMINATIONS FOR FACULTY WHO MEET THE CRITERIA MAY BE
- 59 MADE ON BEHALF OF THE DECEASED FACULTY BY A FACULTY MEMBER IN
- 60 THEIR DEPARTMENT/DIVISION/SCHOOL WITHIN TWO YEARS OF DEATH.

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5 The University appreciates the past services of its retired faculty and encourages their

6 participation in the life of the University community. In this spirit, it extends to all faculty

7 retirees the following courtesies: access to information and guidance concerning pertinent

8 retirement benefits; library privileges; inclusion in the campus directory (unless declined);

9 notification of all important developments or changes affecting their interests or relations with

10 the University or with the State University system; invitations to participate in all

11 commencements, public ceremonies, and convocations on the same basis as active faculty

12 members; and invitations to participate in appropriate seminars, colloquia, lectures, and other

13 scholarly meetings, both as contributors and as audience.

14 Emeritus\_status may be granted to a tenured faculty member who has resigned/retired after a

15 minimum of ten (10) years of distinguished service at California State University, Los Angeles.

16 Faculty granted Emeritus status shall enjoy all the courtesies accorded retired faculty plus the

17 following benefits: inclusion at the head of the corresponding department's/division's/school's

18 faculty list, as well as in the consolidated Emeriti list in the General Catalog; recommendation

19 for life membership in the Alumni Association; a special identification card; receipt of

20 publications and information related to university activities (unless declined); selective invitation

21 to participate in campus councils as consultants, where appropriate and legal; free admission to

22 musical, dramatic, athletic and other University performances; access to electronic

communication and information as long as they are legally and fiscally feasible; faculty library

borrowing privileges; access to campus rooms and facilities for meetings and reunions of

Emeriti; and a faculty parking permit and office space on a space available basis.

26 **Criteria.** It is expected that a faculty member will have at least ten uninterrupted years of

27 distinguished service as a teacher and scholar, and will have made significant contributions to

28 California State University, Los Angeles, prior to resignation/retirement in order to qualify as a

29 candidate for Emeritus status, although exceptions may be made for faculty with fewer years of

30 service who have made exceptional contributions as identified by their faculty colleagues.

31 **Approval.** All tenured faculty who resign/retire may request Emeritus status. The appropriate

32 department/division/school committee and the college dean must each make a recommendation

33 prior to the consideration by the President. The procedure for consideration of Emeritus status

34 MUST be initiated by the faculty member within two years following the effective date of

35 retirement/resignation. For those in the faculty early retirement program (FERP), the effective

36 date of retirement is prior to entering FERP status. To be considered for Emeritus status,

37 resigning/retiring faculty members must submit an updated curriculum vitae, photograph, and

38 brief biography. The recommendations of the department/division/school committee and the

39 college dean shall be forwarded to the Provost and the President along with the personnel action

40 file for final consideration and approval. The President will inform the faculty member of the

41 final decision.

- 42 Posthumous nominations for faculty who meet the criteria may be made on behalf of the
- 43 deceased faculty by a faculty member in their department/division/school within two years of
- 44 death.
