Institutional Structure

Institutional Structure is the foundation of Student Administration; it is through this structure that individual student matriculation is identified. It is therefore important to understand this structure.

The catalog references commonly used terms such as "major" and "option"; while terms such as these are used in day to day interactions with the campus community, it is imperative to know the equivalent terms referenced in GET.



PROGRAM VALUES


In GET, **College** is called **PROGRAM**. Fields requesting Academic Program require a code that is a combination of College and Career level.

PLAN


Major is merged with Degree and is called PLAN.

The Option value includes the Major and Degree and is called SUBPLAN.

Summary

A student's matriculation is made up of Career, Program, Plan & SubPlan. For example, a student pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Art with an option in Design would have the following Values:

Career: UGRD
Program: ALB
Plan: ART BA

SubPlan: **ODESART BA**

Term

Term Values consist of a 4 digit term code. The code consists of Century (first digit), Year (2nd & 3rd digits), and Quarter (last digit).

- Century (1st digit) = 0 or 2
 - $0 = 20^{th}$ century (1947 1999)
- 2 = 21st century (2000)
 Year (2nd & 3rd digits) = the last two numbers in a year. For example the year 2012 would be "12" in the term code.
- Quarter (4th digit). Indicates one of the four quarters as follows:
 - Winter 1
 - \circ Spring 3
 - Summer 6
 - o Fall − 9
