

CSULA Program Impaction (effective Fall 2011)

Program impaction means that the number of applications from fully eligible students to a designated major far exceeds the number of spaces available in that major. However, students can still be admitted to the major if they meet the supplementary admission criteria. The supplemental admission criteria for the designated majors follow below.

Child Development

First time freshmen and transfer students are admitted to the University as a Pre-Child Development major, and are eligible to apply for admission to the major after the completion of the following:

- Completion of CHDV 140, 200, 210 and 220, or the equivalent, with a grade of 'C' or better.
- For the purpose of admission to the program, the above Child Development courses with less than a "C" grade can only be repeated once.
- Completion of 48 of the 60 quarter units needed for lower division GE.
- An overall GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Criminal Justice

First time freshmen and transfer students are admitted to the University as a Pre-Criminal Justice major, and are eligible to apply for admission to the major after the completion of the following:

- CRIM 101 and 126, or the equivalent, with a grade of 'B-' or better.
- CRIM 301 (taken at CSLA) with a grade of 'B-' or better.
- For the purpose of admission to the major, students may not repeat the above courses.
- An overall GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Pre Nursing /Basic Nursing Program

To be admitted to the University as a Pre-Nursing major, students must meet the following:

- Pre-Nursing:
 - First time freshmen
 - High School minimum GPA of 3.00 *and*
 - SAT combined Math and Critical Thinking score of 900 or above, or an ACT Composite score of 20 or above
 - Transfer students
 - Minimum 2.75 transferrable GPA
- Basic Nursing Program (non-RN): Pre-Nursing majors are eligible to apply for admission to the Basic Nursing Program (non-RN) after the completion of the required pre-requisite coursework. For more information, please visit www.calstatela.edu/academic/hhs/nursing/nurs_adm.php.

Psychology

The number of applicants who can be admitted to the major is limited by space availability.

- First time freshmen: Admission of first time freshmen for available spaces in Psychology will be based on a rank ordering of CSU eligible applicants on the basis of their CSU eligibility index.
- Transfer students: Admission of transfer students for available spaces will be based on a rank ordering of cumulative grade point average, with a minimum transferrable GPA of 2.75.

Social Work

First time freshmen and transfer students are admitted to the University as a Pre-Social Work Major, and are eligible to apply for admission to the major after the completion of the following:

- PSY 150 or Soc 201 or Soc 202 (or equivalent) with a grade of 'C+' or better
- SW 370, Field of Social Work with a 'C+' or better. For the purpose of admission to the major, students may not repeat this course.
- Completion of the WPE (ENGL 102 is a prerequisite)
