You have the right to make a complaint against a police officer for any improper police conduct. California law requires this agency to have a procedure to investigate citizen's complaints. You have the right to a written description of this procedure. This agency may find after investigation that there is not enough evidence to warrant action on your complaint. Even if that is the case, you have the right to make a complaint and have it investigated if you believe an officer behaved improperly. Citizen complaints and any reports or findings relating to complaints must be retained by this agency for at least five years. You should also be aware that if you knowingly and maliciously make a false complaint of misconduct against an officer, that the officer may seek monetary damages from you in a civil lawsuit. [Civil Code 47.5.]
