

A-G COLLEGE PREP COURSES

Freshmen applicants must complete 15 units of required high school courses (known as 'A-G') to be eligible for admission. A unit is equal to one academic year or two semesters. Each semester needs to be completed with a grade of 'C' or better.

Checklist

COMPLETE

the **A** thru **G** course pattern with a 'C' or better (refer to chart on the right). Only grades earned in A-G subjects in the 10th, 11th and 12th grades are used to calculate GPA.

TAKE

the **ACT** or **SAT RT** college entrance exams, by December of your senior year and submit official scores to Cal State L.A.

APPLY

for admission to Cal State L.A. by submitting your online application at www.csumentor.edu before the deadline.

TAKE

the required **EPT** and **ELM** placement tests by May 2011 (see back for additional information).

FULFILL

local high school graduation requirements, and have appropriate GPA and ACT/SAT RT Test Scores for CSU Admission Eligibility Index (see back).

CHECK

your admissions status after receiving your campus ID number (CIN) and pin.

EARLY ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (EAP)

- The EAP helps high school students meet college readiness standards in English and mathematics.
- Exams are optional and are given in the spring of the 11th grade as part of the required California Standards Tests (CSTs). Eleventh graders will be notified of testing dates by their schools.
- Benefits of participating in the EAP portion of the CST are:
 - Students may be exempt from the English and Math placements exams, by receiving a qualifying score;
 - Identify the need for additional preparation in English and math to succeed at the CSU while still enrolled in high school;
 - Adjust senior-year coursework to prepare for the CSU; and
 - Avoid spending time and money in college remediation courses that do not count toward a bachelor's degree.

ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST (EPT) / ENTRY-LEVEL MATHEMATICS EXAM (ELM)

EXEMPTIONS FROM THE EPT

- Placement in the "ready for CSU college-level English" category on the Early Assessment of Readiness for College English taken in conjunction with the 11th grade California Standards Test in English Language Arts
- A SAT RT Critical Reading score of 500 or above
- A score of 22 or above on the ACT English Test
- A score of 3 or above in the College Board Advanced Placement Language and Composition or Literature and Composition Exams
- Completion and transfer to the CSU of a transferable college course that satisfies the English composition requirement completed with a grade of 'C' or better

EXEMPTIONS FROM THE ELM

- Placement in the "ready for CSU college-level Mathematics" category on the Early Assessment of Readiness for College Mathematics taken in conjunction with the 11th grade California Standards Test in High School Mathematics or Algebra II
- Placement in the "ready for CSU college-level Mathematics- Conditional" category on the Early Assessment of Readiness for College Mathematics taken in conjunction with the 11th grade California Standards Test in High School Mathematics or Algebra II PLUS successful completion of a CSU-approved math or math-related courses or activity during your senior year
- A score of 550 or above on the mathematics section of either the College Board SAT I: Reasoning Test, or SAT II: Mathematics Test
- A score of 23 or above on the ACT Mathematics
- A score of 3 or above on the College Board Advanced Placement Mathematics examination (Calculus AB or BC, or Statistics)
- Completion and transfer to the CSU of a college course that satisfies the requirement in Quantitative Reasoning completed with a grade of 'C' or better

CSU ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY INDEX

GPA is calculated using grades earned in the A-G courses taken in the 10th-12th grades. All students should submit ACT or SAT Reasoning Test (RT) results regardless of grade point average.
