The charges of the committee were revised to reflect the change in its role in making recommendations to Honors Convocation which is, presently, a College level event. Additionally, changes also include deletion of charges that no longer exist, that is, selection of a University Grand Marshal as well as speaker for commencement, since Colleges select their own Grand Marshals and speakers. Finally, the revision also includes changes to the committee membership.

The Honors Convocation and Commencement Committee (HCCC) at its meeting on October 18, 2019 to recommend the following modifications.

Line 5-14: The wording of the charge was simplified to University Honors and Convocation Committee.

Line 15-22: The wording was removed from the charge because the committee is no longer responsible for recommending speakers to the President for Commencement or for Honors Convocation.

Line 23-43: The wording was removed from the charge because the role of University Grand Marshal has ceased to exist.

Line 44-63: The membership was changed to reflect including one faculty member from Library and Student Life, at least one to a maximum of three students appointed by the Board of Directors of ASI, three ex-officio members appointed by the President and Chair of the Commencement Planning Committee.

Line 64: The wording was changed so that all members of the committee are eligible to vote.

Line 65-66: The annual election of committee Chair and Vice Chair was added.

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21		emphasize the importance of academic excellence and for the judicious

23	3.	Duties of the Grand Marshal. The Grand Marshal is responsible for encouraging
24		participation by all faculty in Honors Convocation and Commencement
25		ceremonies and for reminding all full-time faculty of a professional responsibility
26		to support Honors Convocation and Commencement ceremonies through
27		attendance in academic regalia. The Grand Marshal is responsible for appointing
28		all marshals and recommending the order of the processional and recessional for
29		the two ceremonies. In the fall quarter, the Grand Marshal is also responsible for
30		appointing an Associate Grand Marshal to assist in carrying out the duties of the
31		Grand Marshal and, if necessary, preparing the Grand Marshal Designee to
32		assume the duties of the Grand Marshal in the following year. In making this
33		appointment, the Grand Marshal should take into consideration such factors as
34		experience as a marshal, academic reputation, cultural and gender diversity, and
35		representation of academic disciplines within the University.
36	4.	Selection of Grand Marshal. In the fall quarter, the Honors Convocation and
37		Commencement Committee will recommend to the President the faculty member
38		to be Grand Marshal for the following year (the Grand Marshal designee). In
39		making such a recommendation, the Committee should take into consideration
40		such factors as experience as a marshal, academic reputation, cultural and gender
40		diversity, and representation of academic disciplines within the University.
41		Serious consideration should be given to having the same faculty member serve as
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45		both Associate Grand Marshal and Grand Marshal Designee.

44 45	<b>Membership.</b> The <u>Honors Convocation and</u> UNIVERSITY HONORS AND Commencement <u>CONVOCATION</u> Committee is composed of the following:
46	1. One faculty member from each college and the division, INCLUDING THE
47	LIBRARY AND STUDENT LIFE, selected by the Nominations Committee from
48	a slate of at least three nominees submitted by each of these units, to serve
49	staggered two-year terms. Faculty members in the Library, and Student Affairs
50	are considered the same as a college for this purpose.
51	2. The Grand Marshal. ONE ASSOCIATE DEAN SELECTED BY THE COUNCIL
52	OF ASSOCIATE DEANS.
53	3. The Associate Grand Marshal.
54	4. Three students appointed by the Board of Directors of the Associated Students.
55	Inc. AT LEAST ONE, TO A MAXIMUM OF THREE STUDENT(S)
56	APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ASSOCIATED
57	STUDENTS, INC.
58	5. One THREE ex officio, non-voting memberS appointed by the President. The
59	responsibilities of this ex officio member may be divided between two
60	administrators, one person to serve for the Honors Convocation and the other to
61	serve for Commencement.
62	The Committee elects its own chair annually.
63	6. CHAIR OF THE COMMENCEMENT PLANNING COMMITTEE
64	VOTING. ALL MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE.
65	COMMITTEE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. THE COMMITTEE ELECTS its own A CHAIR
66	AND VICE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR. THE COMMITTEE ELECTS IS OWILA CHAIR
