Minimum one paragraph; maximum 500 words. Should include: **Background**: a brief introduction to the topic including any gaps in knowledge that are relevant to the student project. **Scientific Question**: a concise statement of the scientific question that the student is trying to answer. **Hypothesis** (if the study is mechanistic) or **Goals/Objectives** (if the research is not hypothesis driven): a concise statement of the specific hypotheses or goals/objectives. **Experimental Approach**: an overview of the methodological approach or how the student plans to carry out the project and will analyze the generated data (if known). **Significance**: what will be learned if the study is successfully conducted, and how it contributes to the faculty research program, field of study, and/or society.

Procedures and Deadlines:

Once the project plan is approved by the Thesis Committee, submit the signed prospectus to the department staff member who handles the Undergraduate Honors in Biology/Microbiology Programs no later than the add deadline day of the term in which you expect to enroll in BIOL/MICR 3960 units. Students may enroll in BIOL/MICR 3960 only after the approved prospectus has been submitted to the department. You may register for no more than 3 of the required 4 units of BIOL/MICR 3960 in any one term. You should expect to work on your thesis research at least 10 hours a week for each unit of BIOL/MICR 3960 in which you are enrolled.
