Administrative Summary

The non-returner survey was administered for each term (Fall and Spring).

Non-returner (NR) students here are referred to students who have enrolled a previous term at Cal State LA but have not yet registered for the subsequent upcoming term. These students embody a segment of the campus that typically remains under-investigated and overshadowed in discussions about student success. This survey serves to 1) explore barriers students face that prevent them from continuing enrollment and 2) prompt students to enroll in the subsequent term.

NR students were surveyed in Fall and Spring of the 2022-2023 academic year (see Table 1 for distribution timeline). A total of 825 students responded to the survey with an 8.42% response rate (Table 2).

Prompt to Enroll

Non-Returners are first asked "We noticed that you have not enrolled for Spring 2023. Are you still planning to enroll for Spring 2023/Fall 2022 at Cal State LA?" with "yes" or "no" response choices. NRs who select "yes" will be referred to as Potential Non-Returner (PNR) while those who select "no" will be referred to as Definite Non-Returner (DNR).

Of the total respondents, nearly 83% (n = 684) of students responded as PNR indicating intent to enroll in the following term, and nearly 62% (n = 411) expressed interest to meet with an advisor. PNR are then added to an academic advising outreach listserv. After each survey term administration, we measured the rate of



students who enrolled in the following term. On average, 78.4% (n = 536) of PNRs indeed enrolled for the following term (Table 3).

Potential Non-Returners are asked no further questions and the survey ends. Definite Non-Returners, however, are asked a series of questions exploring reasons for not continuing education and personal student goals. The data is partitioned based on students responding as PNR and DNR.

Potential Non-Returners (PNR) are respondents who marked "Yes" when asked if they are planning to enroll for the following term, while Definite Non-Returners (DNR) are those who marked "No".

Barriers to Enrollment

The top reason for DNRs not re-enrolling in courses are financial constraints (29%), followed by personal reasons (health, family, or other situations; 25%). See Table 4 for frequencies. We explore these reasons further by asking students to specify in open text the reason for not returning to college.

The primary reasons for non-returners, in order of frequency, are:

- Financial constraints (29%)
- Personal reasons such as health, family, or other situations (25%)



- Other reasons (21%)
- Transferring to another institution (18%)
- Academic challenges (16%)

Among those who selected "Other reasons," the predominant reasons included (see Table 5):

- A perceived disconnect with faculty/staff ("...counseling staff ignored my several attempts to contact them" and "Begged for help from every staff I could")
- Academic struggles: limited availability of online classes ("Offered very few online classes" and "None of the classes I need are online")
- External financial strains school ("Gas prices still high. I am transferring back to community college and then to another university that is local to me" and "I am glad for the opportunity given to attend CSULA, as much as I want to continue my education, I can't as I need to work")

After exploring barriers to re-enrollment, we asked DNRs about their educational future. Over 80% reported having plans to continue their education in the future, but only about 41% are considering doing so at Cal State LA specifically (see Table 6).


