Food Pantry

The Cal State LA Food Pantry offers free access to nourishing food to all currently enrolled, degree-seeking students who need a little extra support. Whether it's fresh fruits and vegetables, pantry staples, or culturally familiar ingredients, the team is committed to making sure students have access to food every week. Students will have the opportunity to select their food items through an electronic order form that lists our current inventory.

Weekly appointments can be made through Navigate LA, available in the <u>GETmobile app</u> or <u>MyCalStateLA portal</u>. Reservations can be made up to seven days in advance. Drop-ins are welcome if space is available and staff capacity allows.

CalFresh Outreach Center

The CalFresh Outreach team supports students in applying for and maintaining their CalFresh benefits. CalFresh is a state program that provides a monthly grocery allowance to low-income households through an EBT card that works like a debit card. Students can use it at most grocery stores and some farmers markets, including the one on campus.

Farmers Market

The CalFresh Outreach team hosts a weekly Farmers Market in partnership with Eastmont Community Center to provide the campus community with access to farm-fresh fruits and vegetables while promoting awareness and utilization of CalFresh. CalFresh recipients can use their EBT cards at the market to purchase eligible food items. Students can also access Market Match, a healthy food incentive program that matches up to \$15 of CalFresh benefits.

Emergency Grants

The Office of the Dean of Students offers emergency grants to help students facing unexpected financial crises that may affect their academic success. These grants are meant to supplement existing financial aid.

Location: Student Services Building, Room 4380 (4th floor). To apply, visit the <u>Emergency Grant</u> Application

Hours: Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Basic Needs Grant Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be enrolled in at least 3 units in a degree or credential program
- Must have completed the FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application (if eligible)
- Must provide documentation showing urgent financial need due to unexpected circumstances

Additional Requirements for Housing Support:

- Must be enrolled full-time (12 units for undergraduates, 8 for graduate students)
- Must have exhausted financial resources including subsidized loans
- Must be unable to pay housing expenses due to unexpected circumstances

Grant Amounts:

- Emergency Basic Needs Grant: \$500 to \$1000 per school year
- On-Campus Housing Grant: up to \$2000 per school year
- Off-Campus Housing Grant: up to \$2000 per school year

Application Process:

Submit the online application with supporting documents

- Receive a confirmation message
- Allow 4 to 6 weeks for review after all documents are submitted
- Receive a decision letter by email

Emergency Temporary Housing Program

Cal State LA offers short-term housing for up to 14 days to students experiencing homelessness or housing displacement. The program provides a safe place to stay while students work toward securing permanent housing. Placement depends on space availability and individual circumstances.

Location: Student Services Building, Room 4380 (4th floor). To apply, visit the <u>Emergency</u> Temporary Housing Application

Hours: Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Eligibility:

- Must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program
- Must be unhoused due to extenuating circumstances, at risk of eviction, displaced from unsafe housing, or living in a car or on the street
- Must read and sign the Emergency Housing Terms and Conditions
