If so, how was the appointment made and what is the status of the directorship of UAS? If the people who are responsible for the actual misallocation of funds could keep their jobs and health insurance, why are lecturers losing their jobs so that the University could avert a potential misallocation of resources? Economic violence in regard to Lecturer Faculty What are faculty, staff and students going to do to force a change in regards to budget/course cuts?
INTENT TO RAISE QUESTIONS	3.	3.1	 Chair Avramchuk advised that responses to previous IRQs have not been received yet. Senator Ramos announced her intent to raise the following questions: IRQ: King Hall Remediation and Faculty, Staff, and Student Safety Starting on February 13 Academic Senate. Senator Ramos notified President Eanes that there was a critical toxic King Hall building crisis that needed immediate attention. A few Senators also added more comments of concern and President Eanes, in attendance, responded that she had already received many complaints about King Hall and the CSULA campus. On February 27 in Academic Senate, twelve Senators both provide tstatements and ceded their time for twelve "guest" faculty and staff to provide testimonials of health concerns, including cancer, utilizing almost one and a half hours of testimonials during Academic Senate. Amy Bippus and Queen King responded. On February 29 King Hall Kills Coalition of concerned faculty, staff, and students held a Press Conference with multiple news outlets attending for press coverage, to emphasize our emergency-level concern for our safety and health and to demand immediate evacuation of KH and remote learning options this semester. This was followed by a King Hall Kills Coalition Teach-In where many faculty, students, and staff shared testimonials about the history of King Hall and its toxic and the environmental racism it represents. On March 5 CSULA Labor Council submitted a letter to President Eanes with a request for a meeting time by 3/15. The CSULA Labor Council is made up of the faculty and staff unions at Cal State LA, including CSUEU, Teamsters, UAW, and CFA-LA Chapter, collectively representing nearly 3,000 workers on our campus. On March 7, President Eanes conducted a "100 days" Town Hall as President on campus and via Zoom and many testimonials were provided in person and via Zoom regarding the toxicity of King Hall and the lack of accessibility for persons with physical di
