- 1.1.1 The CSU Trustees' Award for Outstanding Achievement awarded Cal State LA student, Patrick Emmanuel Sangalang, MS in Computer Science with the 2023 Michael A. and Debe Lucki Scholar scholarship.

- 1.3 Visitor Margaret Garcia announced: This week, students will have access to early registration beginning with the Spring 2024 semester as part of the AB 2881 implementation and that's Public Post-Secondary Education: Students with Dependent Children. All students will receive a notification from our University Registrar with instructions to identify as parents of dependent minors via a simple form on GET if they want access to early registration. They will complete the information and sign a certification that the information is true, and they will have access to early registration. This needs to be completed by October 8 to benefit for Spring 2024.
- 2. A concerned was raised about GE to the Senate and Senate was reminded that AB 928 only applies to transfers from CCC into UC and CSU.
