3. Senator Baker announced her intent to raise the following question: This question is addressed to Leroy Morishita, Cal State LA Interim President.

The California Faculty Association and the CSU are in the process of bargaining for salary, workload, and health and safety issues for the final year of our 2022-2024 collective bargaining agreement. While many CSU Presidents and the Chancellor have gotten raises of 29% and more over the past year, CSU faculty were offered an insulting 5% general salary increase for 2023-2024. Given inflation and the rising costs of living in Los Angeles, the CSU is essentially asking us to accept a salary cut. Our lecturer faculty, who teach approximately 60% of classes, face particularly low salaries and CFA is asking the CSU to raise the floor for lecturer faculty. CSULA faculty make sacrifices every day to support and educate our students. Will you support us by asking the CSU Board of Trustees to agree to CFA's salary, workload, and health and safety proposals for the 2022-2024 contract?
