A concern was raised about academic freedom. "I think it would behoove the Academic Senate to review our faculty academic freedom and academic freedom for our students. We've had cases of Islamophobia on campus; there was graffiti in King Hall. We've had a student who does not feel safe on campus because she was told that Gaza should be burned to the ground and she fears for her life. So I think it's important for a really good review, if not even a statement, from Executive Committee about academic
