

About the Survey

- Total N=3,000 (+/-1.8%) Los Angeles Residents
 - Antelope Valley, Long Beach, San Fernando Valley, San Gabriel Valley, SELA, South LA
- Antelope Valley
 - Random Sample N=500 (+/-4.4%)
 - Residents of Antelope Valley randomly selected so that each member has an equal chance of being chosen
 - Community Sourced N= 117
 - Participants selected by accessibility and represent the network of community-connected residents of Antelope Valley
- Focus is on pandemic recovery




About the Survey

- Mixed Mode: 75% online, 25% telephone





- Antelope Valley community sourced sample







Antelope Valley respondents were very likely to talk with friends/family about an issue involving government during the pandemic




Majority of Antelope Valley respondents reported voting for several local public offices




Voter engagement efforts reached under half of Antelope Valley respondents in the 2022 election cycle




Close to half experienced cuts in work hours and struggled to make grocery and rent/mortgage payments during the pandemic




Close to half fell behind at least 1 monthly payment (rent, mortgage, car, utility, etc.) since the pandemic began




An alarming amount reported having less than \$100 saved for emergencies




About 1 in 5 face food insecurity and about 1 in 4 face housing insecurity




About a quarter have relied on several organizations for access to essential needs




The financial situation of over a quarter of Antelope Valley respondents worsened since the pandemic began




Nearly 1 in 5 respondents believe it will take them more than 3 years to recover economically




Close to half reported having been affected by extreme weather (heat, wildfires, drought, etc.)




Close to half reported suffering serious health and financial problems due to extreme weather




Vast majority have received at least 2 COVID vaccines




Majority reports regularly wearing their mask



4 in 10 reported testing positive for COVID




Doctors and healthcare professionals are the most trusted messengers for COVID guidance and recommendations




Majority believes the worst of the pandemic is over and there is a need to address the issues it created
