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Natalie Liberman is an Assistant Professor of Management in the College of Business and Economics at California State University, Los Angeles, where she also serves as the PIHRA (Professionals in Human Resources Association) Faculty Advisor. She is originally from Los Angeles, California, and received her undergraduate degree in Business Marketing from California State University, Long Beach, and her MBA in Human Resource Management from California State University, Dominguez Hills. She earned her PhD in Management from Washington State University. Her research explores restorative responses to workplace wrongdoing and how offenders can reintegrate and repair themselves after committing workplace violations. Prior to joining CSULA, Dr. Liberman worked at the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University, Bloomington, where she taught courses in leadership, negotiations, DEIB, and human resource management.
