

WHO IS A MANDATED REPORTER?

MANDATORY REPORTING OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT Executive Order 1083*

> **CSU** employees or volunteers required under CANRA and CSU policy to report suspected child abuse and neglect to specified authorities.

For the purposes of this policy, "Mandated **Reporters**" includes two categories: Limited **Reporters and General Reporters; "Mandated Reporter**" refers to both **Limited Reporters and** General Reporters.

WHO IS A CSU LIMITED REPORTER AND **GENERAL REPORTER?**

• is a category of Mandated Reporter, in accordance with California Penal Code § 11165.7(a)(41), and defined by the CSU as those who are legally required to report child abuse or neglect only if it "Limited occurs on CSU premises or at an official activity of, or program conducted by, the CSU **Reporters**" • is a category of Mandated Reporter, defined by the CSU as those who are legally required to report child abuse or neglect no matter where it occurs. For the purposes of this policy, any employee who satisfies "General the criteria for both Limited Reporters and General Reporters will be designated as a General Reporter. **Reporters**"




WHY IS REPORTING **CRITICAL?**



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WHAT TYPES OF CONDUCT MUST BE **REPORTED?**

Child abuse or neglect that occurs on campus or at an official activity of, or program conducted by Cal State LA.



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WHEN TO REPORT

If you suspect



When you, in the scope of your employment at Cal State LA, reasonably suspect that a child has been abused or neglected.

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REPORT

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1. <u>Within</u> 36 hours of receiving the information concerning the incident: Complete Form SS <u>8572</u>; and send, fax, or electronically transmit it to the agency that was contacted by phone from **Step 1**, **#4**.

*In case of an emergency or if a crime is in progress, employees should always immediately call campus police or 911.

2. At the time of the phone call, the Mandated Reporter <u>must</u> <u>provide</u> the following information, if known: Their name, business address, and telephone number as the Mandated Reporter

The child's location

The name(s), address(es), and telephone number(s) of the child's parent(s), guardian(s), or caretaker(s)

The source of information that led to the suspicion of child abuse

The name(s), address(es), telephone number(s), and other personal information of person(s) who might have abused the child

The child's name, address, and present

SAFEGUARDS FOR MANDATED REPORTERS

- Immunity- Make the report in good faith
- Confidentiality Your ID and report are confidential
- Whistleblower Protection: Supervisors cannot prevent you from reporting or retaliate for doing SO
- Joint Reports: If 2 people suspect \rightarrow one report
- Follow your Program's Documentation Requirements
