FALL 2025 ADMISSIONS AT A GLANCE

- Cal State Apply Filing Period:
 October 1-December 2, 2024
- Admission requirements must be completed by end of Spring 2025.
- Transfers must report all colleges attended and enter courses in the Cal State Apply application.
- Most admission decisions are made using self-reported information.



FALL 2025 CHANGES

Cal State LA has discontinued campus impaction and has only six impacted majors. There are an additional three majors, while not impacted, have supplemental requirements. Except for these nine select majors, transfer applicants who meet the minimum CSU transfer requirements will be offered admission.



Lower Division Transfers

Cal State LA is now accepting applications from lower division <u>and</u> upper division transfer students. Lower-division applicants do not qualify for impacted majors <u>and</u> Fire Protection Administration Technology BS.

IMPACTED AND SPECIALIZED MAJORS

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Major Specific Criteria (MSC)

- 6 impacted majors with MSC for admission:
- Computer Science BS
- Criminal Justice BS
- Nursing BS
- Psychology BA
- Social Work BA
- Television, Film and Media Studies BA

Supplemental Criteria

- Due to their specialized curriculum, the following non-impacted majors also have supplemental criteria:
 - Fire Protection Administration
 Technology BS lower division Fire
 Science courses
 - Music BM performance audition for admission
 - Urban Learning BA: Teacher Prep required 2.50 GPA for teaching credential

LOWER DIVISION TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

- Meet CSU Freshman Admission Requirements, including min 2.50 HS GPA for CA HS graduates/CA residents (or 3.00 HS GPA for non-CA residents);
- Complete less than 60 transferable semester units prior to enrolling at Cal State LA;
- Complete these two GE courses with grades of 'C-' or better:



- Achieve a minimum overall transferable GPA of 2.00;
- Be in good standing at last institution attended;
- If needed, satisfy the English Language Proficiency requirement (TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, or DuoLingo English); and
- For Music BM, pass the performance audition.

UPPER DIVISION TRANSFER

To be considered for transfer admission to a CSU campus, students must meet these minimum requirements. For Fall admission, all criteria must be completed by the end of the Spring term.

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Transferable Units

Completion of at least 60 transferable semester units, which includes 30 units of CSU General Education (GE)

GE Breadth

Completion of following college-level courses with grades of **C-** or better.

- A1: Oral Communication
- A2: Written Communications
- A3: Critical Thinking
- B4: Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning

Transferable GPA Minimum 2.00 transferable GPA

Academic Standing Good academic standing at last college attended

Major Specific Criteria (MSC)

Meet the Cal State LA Major Specific Criteria (MSC), for select majors.

English Language Proficiency

If needed, satisfy the <u>English Language Proficiency</u> requirement) (e.g. • TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, Duolingo English)

MAJOR SPECIFIC CRITERIA (MSC) for ADMISSION

To facilitate timely graduation, we strongly encourage applicants to complete lower division major courses or earn an **Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T/AS-T)**.

Social Work

Transfer students completing an approved Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) in a major deemed similar:

- Required ADT major: Social Work and Human Services
- **Required** minimum cumulative GPA: 2.65

Transfer students not completing the ADT:

- Required minimum cumulative GPA: 2.75
- Required major preparation courses (grade of "C" or better required):
 - One of the following two courses:
 - PSY 1500 Introductory Psychology
 - SOC 2010 Introduction to Sociology
 - One of the following three statistics courses:
 - ECON 1090 Quantitative Reasoning with Statistics
 - MATH 1090 Quantitative Reasoning with Statistics with Lab
 - SOC 2100 Elementary Statistics

SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESSES

Nursing BSN Nursing CAS due Jan 3, 2025 Music BM Audition due Feb 7, 2025

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

Regardless of citizenship or immigration status, if an upper division transfer applicant does <u>not</u> have at least **3 full-time years (or 60 transferable units) at a college where English is the only language of instruction**, they will have to satisfy the **English Language Proficiency** requirement.

Acceptable assessments/exams:

- TOEFL
- PTE
- IELTS
- DuoLingo English



TRANSFER ADMISSION ROUNDS



Non-Impacted/ Non-Specialized Majors


CSU eligible applicants are guaranteed admission.

Impacted/Specialized Majors

Except for Nursing and Music BM, CSU eligible applicants who meet the required minimum MSC GPA and prerequisite courses will be admitted.


SPACE AVAILABLE BY MAJOR

If space is available after Rounds 1 and 2, then CSU eligible applicants to impacted programs without the required MSCs will be considered based on a ranking of the criteria completed with local applicants receiving a 0.25 GPA bump.



TRANSFER PLANNER AT A GLANCE

The CSU Transfer Planner is an online tool that empowers California Community College students to explore and plan a successful transfer to Cal State LA!





Students may use the planner to log in their community college coursework to track general education progress and compare their current GPA against the transfer admission requirements.

CAL STATE APPLY **TIPS**

- Use an email that they will have continuous access to – do not use school email address
- Write down CAS ID and their login information
- Enter their full, legal name in the application
- If they have one, don't leave SSN blank
- Have unofficial transcripts for reference
- If taken, report test scores (AP, IB, CLEP)
- If applying to an impacted major, accurately "match" courses for pre-requisites in the Program Materials section.
- Use the Cal State Apply Applicant Help Center, including CHAT!



COMMON SPRING TERM PIT FALLS

- Not passing Golden 4 or final term courses with grades of 'C-' or better.
- Not completing courses as planned, including repeated courses by end of Spring 2025.
- Not submitting official AP/IB/CLEP scores that were used to meet Golden 4 or the 60 units.
- Forgetting to submit official final college transcripts with posted spring grades by July 15.
- Disregarding emails/calls about missing information/documents.




California Dream Act Application (CADAA) dream.csac.ca.gov

Application Available: December, 2024

Key Changes: FSA ID Required

- All users must create a studentaid.gov account
- Account creation contains Personal Information questions
- Users will continue to set up multi-factor authentication
- Identity match with Social Security Administration (SSA) will be completed when Social Security Number is provided





Key Changes: FSA ID for Non-SSN

- Users can apply without entering an SSN
- Users without an SSN will complete a knowledge-based identity verification process
 - Undocumented parents or undocumented spouses of US Citizens or Permanent Residents
 - We encourage students and parents to request their FSA ID as soon as it becomes available



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IMPORTANT

- Every required contributor must have an FSA ID to sign the FAFSA application
- Every contributor must consent to transfer federal tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA even if they did not file taxes
- If a student or contributor refuses to provide consent, the student will not be considered for federal student aid, CA state aid, nor institutional aid



Dependency Status

For the 2025-26 award year, an independent student is one of the following:

- born before Jan. 1, 2002
- married (and not separated)
- a graduate or professional student (MA or Doctoral program)
- a veteran
- a member of the armed forces
- an orphan
- a ward of the court or foster youth
- someone with legal dependents other than a spouse
- unaccompanied and homeless or self-supporting and at risk of being homeless



Divorced Parents

The parent that contributes most to the student's living expenses is the parent that will provide their information to the student's FAFSA.

-If the parents' contributions are equal, then the parent with the higher income must complete the FAFSA.

-The other divorced parent's income will not be reported, nor will they be counted in the household size







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Federal Work Study




- Based on demonstrated need
- Student must find a Work-Study job
- 10 20 hours per week and paid directly to student
- At least the minimum wage, never below




