

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 0.9%** since 2019, falling by 162,249. Population is expected to **decrease by 2.3%** between 2024 and 2029, losing 416,557.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **increased by 1.4%** in 5 California Counties from 9,287,596 to **9,422,025**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.4% by 3.0%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 62.5% to 62.7% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **21.7% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (0.1% above the national average), and **7.5% hold an Associate's Degree** (1.3% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Individual and Family Services.



Sep 2025 Labor Force Breakdown




Educational Attainment





Unemployment by Gender








Job Trends






















Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Growing Occupations




Top Occupation Employment Concentration




Top Occupation Earnings



Educational Pipeline

In 2024, there were 382,894 graduates in 5 California Counties. This pipeline has grown by 7% over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Certificate), "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Associate's), and "Business Administration and Management, General" (Bachelor's).
