

## Heather Lattimer, EdD

Heather Lattimer, EdD is Dean of the Connie L. Lurie College of Education at San José State University (SJSU). During her tenure, the college has grown student enrollment, increased diversity among students, faculty, and staff, built new programs that extend access to historically marginalized communities, deepened community partnerships, significantly increased faculty research productivity, and grown philanthropic and grant-funded support. At SJSU, Dr. Lattimer has also served as Interim Dean of the College of Social Sciences and Interim Vice Provost for Undergraduate Education. She leads the San José K16 Collaborative, an innovative, equity-driven, multi-institution partnership building academic and career pathways into the high demand fields of engineering, technology, health care, and education. Dr. Lattimer began her career as a middle and high school teacher and was a professor and director of a research institute at the University of San Diego. Her research focuses on K12 literacy, college access, and teacher education. She has published widely for academic and practitioner audiences. She holds earned degrees from Harvard, Stanford, and the University of California, San Diego.
