¹Effective Fall 2024, the nurse practitioner programs have increased to 900 clinical hours. This meets the newly updated requirements set forth by the National Organization of Nurse Practitioner Faculties (NONPF).

[‡]Student must choose between Thesis/Project or Comprehensive Exam and register accordingly. Thesis/Project requires a 3.5 GPA, an "A" in NURS 5900, and a committee of a minimum of 2 faculty members sought out by the student. The paperwork to start the Thesis/Project must be submitted *before* the final year of study. The Comprehensive Exam must be taken the last term of study along with final coursework or any term after completion of all coursework. Students that choose the comprehensive exam (NURS 5960) must take a directed elective (NURS 5850) the second Fall OR Spring semester.
