Upcoming Grant Opportunities

MUREP Earth Science Systems Research ([MUREP](#) [ESSR](#))

Scope: This Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) seeks to establish MUREP ESSR Institutes led by MSIs that can accelerate discovery and innovation in a broad array of Earth Science research categories aligned with the Earth Science to Action focus areas, outlined in the NASA Earth Science to Action Strategy 2024-2034 plan. Proposals shall respond to one of the seven Science Research Case Concepts associated with a research area listed in Appendix 13-A, MUREP ESSR Science Research Case Concepts and Contacts.

Agency: National Aeronautics and Space Administration

Deadline: October 30, 2024

Funding amount: award ceiling \$1,200,000

Hispanic-Serving Institutions: Enriching Learning, Programs, and Student Experiences ([HSI:ELPSE](#))

Scope: The goals of the program are to 1: enhance the quality of undergraduate science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education at HSIs. 2) increase the recruitment, retention, and graduation rates of students pursuing associates or baccalaureate degrees in STEM at HSIs. An emphasis is placed on understanding and embracing students' strengths, challenges, and lived experiences. The solicitation specifically focuses on studying and improving the student experience in STEM courses for students pursuing STEM degrees, certificate, minor and/or degree programs, academic departments or divisions, and schools and colleges that represent a part of the entire institution.

Agency: National Science Foundation

Deadline: February 12, 2025

Funding amount: \$200,000 and up

The Huntington Library, Art Museum and Botanical Gardens ([The Huntington](#))

Scope: The Huntington offers academic fellowships for scholars working on projects in any area where The Huntington's collections are strong. There are specific awards for maritime history (the Kemble Fellowship), the history of medicine (the Molina Fellowship), and the history of science (the Dibner Fellowship). Three awards (the Thom Fellowships) are reserved for recent postdoctoral scholars. The academic term fellowships are open to scholars working on projects in any of The Huntington's collections strengths.

Long-Term Awards: The Huntington offers **13 academic year fellowships** for nine to 11 months in residence, each with a stipend of \$50,000, and **2 academic term fellowships** for 4-5 months in residence with a stipend of \$25,000.

Short-Term Awards: Approximately 140 short-term fellowships are available for one to three months for research in areas where The Huntington's collections are strong.

Deadline: November 15, 2024


