Overview of Current and Recent Positions

I am currently Professor and former Chair (2016 to 2022) of the Department of Counseling, Educational Psychology and Research (CEPR) at the University of Memphis. In this role, I had the day-to-day duties of directing CEPR and all associated staff. CEPR is a comprehensive, interdisciplinary department offering degree programs that are fully accredited by the American Psychological Association (Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology), the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (M.S. degrees in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Clinical Rehabilitation, Rehabilitation Counseling, and School Counseling, and a Ph.D. in Counselor Education and Supervision). I had direct authority over the department's

annual operating budget of \$3.7 million, supervised a support staff of 4, and led a department of 24 tenure line faculty.

Prior to my joining the faculty of the University of Memphis, I was the Associate Director of the Center for Rehabilitation Science and Engineering (CERSE) and Associate Professor (with tenure) in the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Virginia Commonwealth University. I also led CERSE's research efforts within its Defense and Veterans node.

Administrative Accomplishments

As Chair of CEPR, I:

- Increased the department's sponsored programs portfolio to over \$10.4million (more than 400% increase in my five years as chair)
- Increased enrollment by more than 27%
- Led the creation of a new M.S. in Addictions Counseling
- Led the creation of a new M.S. in Marriage, Couple, and Family Counseling
- Led the creation of a new post-baccalaureate certificate program in Disability Support Services
- Instrumental in the transition of an existing Ed.D. program in Counselor Education and Supervision to a Ph.D.
- Oversaw the first annual campaign drive for the department
- Secured funding from the university for student recruitment initiatives

In my six years as CERSE Associate Director, I:

- Created and directed the research development arm of CERSE
- Assisted in increasing CERSE's return on investment of seed dollars to \$51 returned for every \$1 provided
- Assisted in obtaining 30 grants with a total value worth over \$69 million
- Assisted department's ranking increase from #16 to #11 in the nation in terms of NIH funding (at the time, we were the only VCU School of Medicine unit to be ranked in the top 20)
