
22nd Annual Policy Conference The Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach: Links In A Chain Speaker Biographies



Dr. Lynn Mahoney **Provost** California State University, Los Angeles

Dr. Mahoney became provost of California State University, Los Angeles, in February 2015. As the university's chief academic officer, she is charged with responsibility for fulfilling the University's teaching and research mission including oversight of eight academic colleges. Prior to her appointment as provost, she served as vice provost & dean of Undergraduate Studies at California State University, Long Beach, from 2008-2014. A tireless advocate for students, Dr. Mahoney has spent her academic career working on issues related to enhancing student learning and improving retention and graduation rates. She has a proven track

record on implementing and delivering initiatives aimed at improving the educational experience of all students. Dr. Mahoney received a bachelor's degree in American studies from Stanford University and a Ph.D. in history from Rutgers University. She is the author of Elizabeth Stoddard and the Boundaries of Bourgeois Culture and has lectured extensively on the construction of whiteness in the U.S. and the construction of gender globally.



Eric Garcetti Mayor City of Los Angeles @LAMayor

Eric Garcetti is the 42nd Mayor of Los Angeles. His "back to basics" agenda is focused on job creation and solving everyday problems for L.A. residents. Garcetti was elected four times by his peers to serve as president of the Los Angeles City Council from 2006 to 2012. From 2001 until taking office as Mayor, he served as the Councilmember representing the 13th District that includes Hollywood, Echo Park, Silver Lake, and Atwater Village -- all of which were dramatically revitalized under Garcetti's leadership.

Garcetti was raised in the San Fernando Valley and earned his B.A. and M.A. from Columbia University. He studied as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford and the London School of Economics and taught at Occidental College and USC. A fourth generation Angeleno, he and his wife, Amy

Elaine Wakeland, have a young daughter. He is a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy reserve and is an avid jazz pianist and photographer.



Dr. Raphael J. Sonenshein
Executive Director
Pat Brown Institute for Public Affairs at Cal State LA

Dr. Raphael J. Sonenshein is the executive director of the Pat Institute for Public **Affairs** at CSU Angeles. Previously, he was chair of the Division of Politics. Administration, and Justice at CSU Fullerton. He received his B.A. from Princeton, and his M.A. and Ph.D. from Yale. He is the author of three books on Los Angeles politics and government. Dr. Sonenshein served as executive director of the Los Angeles (Appointed) Charter Reform Commission. He served as Executive Director of the Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Review Commission. He was Best Educator and Distinguished College Faculty Member at CSUF. He received a

Wang Family Excellence Award. He was the first winner of the campus wide Carol Barnes Award for Teaching Excellence and one of two co-winners of the Haynes Foundation Research Impact award. He was the fall 2008 Fulbright Tocqueville Distinguished Chair in American Studies at the University of Paris 8.



Stephen Cheung
President
World Trade Center Los Angeles (WTCLA)

Stephen Cheung leads WTCLA, which attracts foreign direct investment into L.A. County, provides trade facilitation and increases exports out of L.A. County, which drive innovation, jobs creation and prosperity for the region's communities and residents. Mr. Cheung was most recently the secretary general of foreign affairs and trade for Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti and was responsible for managing policies and programs related to Port of Los Angeles. Concurrently, Mr. Cheung was the director of international trade for the Port of Los Angeles.

He also served as managing director of international trade and clean technology for former Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa. He received both his bachelor's in psychobiology and master's in social welfare from UCLA. He currently teaches a course on public policy at the Luskin School of Public Affairs, and serves on the Advisory Council of USC's Center for International Business Education and Research and the Los Angeles Cleantech Incubator.



Patrick O'Donnell Assemblymember California State Assembly, District 70

In November 2014, Patrick O'Donnell was elected to the California State Assembly to represent District 70, which includes Long Beach, Signal Hill, San Pedro and Catalina Island. 

Dr. Suja Lowenthal DPD Vice Mayor City of Long Beach

Dr. Suja Lowenthal was elected to the Long Beach City Council in June 2006 and as vice mayor in 2014. Her council district includes much of the port, harbor and coastline areas, as well as downtown. She holds a bachelor's in economics from UCLA, a master's in business administration from California State University, Los Angeles and a doctorate in policy, planning and development from the University of

Southern California. Ben De Alba Assistant Secretary Rail and Ports at the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA)

Ben De Alba is the assistant secretary for rail and ports at the California State Transportation Agency. responsible for the port's signature environmental program, the Green Port Policy, and the San Pedro Bay Ports Clean Air Action Plan. Local 13 is the largest local on the West Coast and works the fourth largest and busiest port in North America. Mr. Olvera is a third generation longshoreman, and in his 26-year history with the ILWU, he has served on the executive board, the

political action committee, and as a caucus delegate on the local level. His career as an officer included terms as a chief dispatcher, business agent and three years as vice president, ultimately leading to his election as president in 2013 and re-election in 2015. Mr. Olvera serves on the board of directors for the Miguel Contreras Advocacy Foundation, and on the board of directors for the United Way of Greater Los Angeles, Labor Community Services. From 2011 to 2013, he also served as the executive vice president of the Los Angeles County Federation of Labor AFL-CIO.



Dr. Robert Garcia Mayor City of Long Beach

Dr. Robert Garcia, 37, is an educator and the 28th Mayor of Long Beach. He is also a member of the California Coastal Commission, where he serves as an alternate. Mayor Garcia has taken a leadership role in economic development, education, and investing in technology. Garcia served as vice mayor from 2012 - 2014 and was elected to the City Council in 2009.
