



He got his start in the industry at KABC, where he worked for about a year as a news assistant and video journalist. He has had reporting jobs in Eugene, Oregon, and Louisville. He currently works in Salt Lake City. Ochoa has covered major news events like the Saugus High School shooting in Santa Clarita, but also significant sporting events like the Olympics Trials and the Kentucky Derby.

Toni Reveles is a Los Angeles-based content creator. She graduated with her master's degree from the University of Southern California. During her time at Cerritos College, she was the sports copy editor for a year where her duties varied from covering stories daily for the digital and print media to enhancing audience engagement. Moreover, at Cal State LA, she enhanced her broadcast experience by participating in a weekly broadcast show. In addition to reporting, she worked behind the camera directing episodes, floor managing, and working with a teleprompter. During her time with ESPN, Reveles produced daily teases and montages for SportsCenter AM and storylines for NBA Countdown and WNBA Countdown.

He won an Associated Press Sports Editors awards for feature-story writing in 2017 and game-story writing in 2001, and Orange County Press Club Awards for feature and game-story writing in 1996 and 1997. A native of East Lyme, Connecticut, and a graduate of Cal State Fullerton, he began writing for The Times in 1981 and retired this past March.

Seth Burton

Seth Burton is in his eighth year as the sr. vice president of communications and content for the Los Angeles Football Club (LAFC). Burton works as the primary spokesperson and coordinator for all facets of LAFC's public relations and communications strategies, ensuring a unified and consistent voice across all channels. Burton brings over 25 years of professional sports experience to LAFC, joining the club after spending 11 seasons (2006-2017) in the public relations department of the Los Angeles Clippers, where he served as the Clippers' vice president of communications from 2013 to 2017.



Ashley Mackey

Ashley Mackey is an Inglewood native and community journalist for ABC7 Eyewitness News. She joined the team in August 2019 after reporting and anchoring in Phoenix, Arizona, for Cronkite News on Arizona PBS. Mackey earned her master's degree in sports journalism from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication. At ASU, she worked on the "Hate in America" project, which garnered awards such as a Robert F. Kennedy Award, an Edward R. Murrow Award, a BEA Award and an EPPY Award. After earning a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism from the University of Montana, which she attended with a full-ride tennis scholarship, Mackey joined the professional tour for two years.

Ros Gold-Onwude

(Pronounce: GOLD-ON-WOOD-DAY)

Ros Gold-Onwude is an award-winning sports broadcaster covering men's and women's basketball at every level. Gold-Onwude earned a bachelor's degree in communications, followed by a master's degree in sociology of business, both from Stanford University. As a member of the Stanford women's basketball team Gold-Onwude played in three Final Fours and two national championship games helping the Cardinal win four conference titles as starting guard and was named the 2010 Pac-10 Co-Defensive Player of the Year. Following her Stanford career, Gold-Onwude played on the Nigerian National Basketball Team. Over the course of her journalism career, she has covered the game of basketball on the most elite stages from the Olympics, NBA, and WNBA Finals to the NCAA Tournament.



Special Guests



Michael Cooper

Michael Cooper, a Hall of Famer and five-time NBA champion with the iconic Showtime Lakers, is widely regarded as one of the greatest defenders in NBA history. Known for his intensity, versatility, and trademark knee-high socks, Cooper earned eight NBA All-Defensive Team selections and was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year in 1987.

Drafted by the Lakers in 1978, Cooper played a key role alongside Magic Johnson and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar during one of the franchise's most dominant eras. Over his 12-year NBA career, he developed a reputation as a defensive stopper and fan favorite, with crowds regularly chanting "Coooooop" whenever he had the ball.

After retiring as a player, Cooper transitioned into coaching and made history as the only person to win championships in the NBA, WNBA, and NBA D-League. He led the Los Angeles Sparks to two WNBA titles, earned Coach of the Year honors, and coached teams at the collegiate and professional levels, including a D-League championship with the Albuquerque Thunderbirds.

In addition to coaching, Cooper has spent over 25 years as an analyst for ABC's Sports Zone and currently serves as associate head coach for Cal State LA Men's Basketball. His impact on the game—both on the court and from the sidelines—continues to influence players and fans alike.



Metta World

Metta World Peace, formerly known as Ron Artest, is an NBA champion, All-Star, and one of the most outspoken mental health advocates in professional sports. His journey from the streets of Queensbridge, New York, to the pinnacle of basketball success is marked not only by athletic achievement but by personal transformation. His powerful story is chronicled in the Emmy-nominated Showtime Sports documentary Quiet Storm: The Ron Artest Story, which shines a light on his battle with anxiety and depression at a time when mental health in sports was rarely discussed.

Over his 18-year professional career, World Peace played for the Chicago Bulls, Indiana Pacers, Sacramento Kings, Houston Rockets, New York Knicks, and most notably, the Los Angeles Lakers, where he helped secure the 2010 NBA championship. That same year, he famously thanked his therapist in a post-game interview after making the championship-clinching shot. Internationally, he also played in China and Italy. He later raffled off his championship ring to support mental health services and became a public face for the cause, even testifying before Congress in support of the Mental Health in Schools Act.

For his efforts, World Peace received the 2011 J. Walter Kennedy Citizenship Award and has since continued his mission to promote mental health awareness, especially in underserved communities. He serves as chief impact director for OOTify, a social impact mental health platform, and is the founder of Artest Management Group, where he is currently raising a \$1 billion venture fund to support businesses focused on mental health and wellness innovation.

A frequent speaker and author of the candid autobiography No Malice, World Peace shares his unfiltered life story—from a childhood surrounded by violence and mental illness to becoming a championship-winning NBA star.
