

Stipend Programs (AY 2024-2025)

SECTION I. School of Social Work (SSW) Stipend Program Application Process

Please review the attached chart (Section II) which outlines the stipend programs currently available. If you have any questions, please contact the Program Coordinator listed for the stipend you are interested in.

- i. Applicants must be admitted to the SSW MSW Program before they apply.
- ii. Applicants are allowed to apply for two stipend programs within the same stipend category only (See the chart below).
 - For example, an applicant may apply to both HCAI and PBH stipend programs but *not* to HCAI and the LA DCFS Stipend.
- iii. If accepted into both programs of the same category, applicants must choose one stipend program and immediately withdraw from the other stipend program.
- iv. Each stipend program has its own awardee selection policy and specific application requirements. Specific program information and applications are provided with the MSW program acceptance packet once students are admitted.
