To help first-generation college students, East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania (ESU) launched its 1st Gen project in September. Faculty and staff who were in the first generation of their families to go to college will be invited to wear buttons that say "1ST GEN" to identify themselves on campus for current first-generation students who have questions or just want to talk to someone who was once in their shoes. As of fall 2016, first-generation college students made up 28.5 percent of ESU undergraduates. **Read more**

Three veteran faculty members have been named the first recipients of Vaughn Professorships at Arkansas State University. The professorships were created through a gift of \$3.69 million from the estate of James E. and Wanda Lee Vaughn, alumni of the university. The gift from the Vaughns, who were inducted in 1999 into the university's Legacy Society for donors of planned gifts, also provided a scholarship endowment and other initiatives benefitting the university. **Read more**

Black Hills State University (S.D.)

Black Hills State University was awarded a \$785,000 grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to support South Dakota high schools in implementing computer science courses. The project, Expanding Pathways into Computer Science across South Dakota, will build upon previous work also funded by the NSF with an expanded focus: reaching rural regions and underserved students throughout the state, including those on or near American Indian reservations. California State University, Los Angeles

California State University, Los Angeles has been awarded a \$250,000 grant to create a fast track for students studying to become math teachers. The grant from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) will be used to create an expedited Integrated Teacher Preparation Program in mathematics, commonly known as SCOPE. Read more

Central Michigan University

?Two Central Michigan University physics professors are at the forefront of a four-year, \$4.8 million U.S. Department of Energy research grant. The project spans five universities and 10 senior scientists. Read more

North Carolina Central University

North Carolina Central University has been awarded \$16.3 million by the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD), part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), for a new Research Center in Minority Institutions (RCMI) focusing on elevating the university's health disparities research program. Pittsburg State University (Kan.)

A nearly \$900,000 grant awarded to Greenbush - The Southeast Kansas Education Service Center aims to help those teachers at public schools across Kansas by partnering with the Kansas Center for Career and Technical Education at Pittsburg State University to enhance its mentoring program. **Read more**

University of Arkansas at Little Rock

- Dr. Paul Crutcher, assistant professor of English at UA Little Rock, has received a grant from the Freeman Foundation to teach the Consortium for Teaching about Asia program to Arkansas teachers. Crutcher has received more than \$15,000 to host the program, which is a multi-year initiative to encourage and facilitate teaching and learning about East Asia in elementary and secondary schools nationwide. - · Little Rock engineering company Bernhard TME has announced a \$50,000 gift to the UA Little Rock's Facilities Management Event Fund, which provides scholarships to facilities management employees. In the past six years, the fund has awarded 210 scholarships totaling \$166,000. Fifteen scholarship recipients have completed degrees. Read more

University of Central Oklahoma

University of Central Oklahoma alumnus and former student athlete Chad Richison, founder and CEO of Oklahoma City-based Paycom Software Inc., has donated an additional \$4 million to the UCO Athletics Complete the Dream campaign. As the second-largest gift in university history, Richison's recent contribution is surpassed only by his previous gift of \$10 million in 2015, the single-largest gift in university history and among the largest ever received by a National Collegiate Athletic Association Division II institution.
