- Black Hills State University (BHSU) connects international students with local families through
 the Family Connection Program, which matches students with a family for an academic school
 year. This program seeks to build lasting relationships and to create rewarding international
 experiences for both students and families. Read more
- BHSU continues to strengthen its global presence through a partnership with the University of
 Ljubljana in Slovenia, a central-European country, that has already resulted in several successful
 student and faculty exchanges. The partnership has also lead to the launch of a joint-research
 project comparing recent demographic changes in South Dakota and Slovenia's rural areas.

Arkansas State University

- Arkansas State University recently announced the creation of the Spades Family Endowed
 Scholarship, founded to help deserving pre-dental students finance and fulfill education
 priorities at Arkansas State. The scholarship, which is the first created for a pre-dental student at
 A-State, was established following a commitment of \$30,000 by the Spades family of Jonesboro
 to the Arkansas State University Foundation. Drs. William and Joseph Spades, both A-State
 alumni, are dentists in Jonesboro. Read more
- In recognition of a \$5 million contribution by First National Bank to the Red Wolves Foundation, the Arkansas State University's multi-purpose facility previously known as the Convocation Center will become "First National Bank Arena." First National Bank's gift of \$5 million, one of the largest in A-State Athletics history, guarantees it the naming rights to the facility through Dec. 31, 2029. Read more

Buffalo State College, State University of New York

The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation has awarded \$2.1 million to State University of New York (SUNY) Buffalo to support the Patricia H. and Richard E. Garman Art Conservation Department and the two other U.S. art conservation graduate programs—the Conservation Center at the Institute of Fine Arts, New York University, and the Winterthur/University of Delaware Program in Art Conservation. The award is intended to further a collaborative project in the area of library and archives conservation education. **Read more**

California State University, Northridge

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has awarded California State University, Northridge's College of Health and Human Development a \$1 million, four-year grant to support undergraduate and graduate students and to enhance their education experience as they prepare for careers as registered dietitians. **Read more**

California State University, San Bernardino

- California State University, San Bernardino's (Cal State San Bernardino) Upward Bound and
 Upward Bound Math have been awarded \$4,023,440 in federal funding for their programs to
 help students in San Bernardino and Rialto graduate from high school and to enroll and
 graduate from college. The five-year funding starts in 2018, and offers outreach and program
 services for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds, including low-income, firstgeneration students and individuals with disabilities, to advance through the academic
 pipeline. Read more
- The Cal State San Bernardino Community-based Art (CBA) initiative has been awarded a
 three-year contract with the California Arts Council. The contract's funding of more than \$1.6
 million will allow CBA to significantly increase its programming inside California state prisons,
 expanding its partnerships with other California State University campuses and growing jobs in

Colorado State University-Pueblo

One of eight recipients of a 100,000 Strong in the Americas Innovation Fund grant, Colorado State University-Pueblo, the Colorado State University Todos Santos Center, and Autonomous University of Baja California Sur (UABCS) will collaborate to establish an Institute of Ecotourism Studies in Baja California Sur, Mexico, by providing education around the role and impacts of tourism on local cultures and communities. **Read more**

Frostburg State University (Md.)

Maryland Governor Larry Hogan recently announced a \$300,000 state investment to establish the new Office of Regional Development and Engagement at Frostburg State University (FSU). The office will integrate FSU's resources with regional partners in Western Maryland to help communities and companies be competitive and meet the unique challenges of development in rural regions. **Read more**

Salisbury University (Md.)

A Salisbury University (SU) program to help create jobs throughout the mid-Atlantic will continue another five years, thanks to a new \$1 million gift from the Philip E. and Carole R. Ratcliffe Foundation. The Ratcliffe Shore Hatchery entrepreneurship competition in SU's Franklin P. Perdue School of Business, established with the foundation's initial \$1 million contribution in 2013, will continue through at least 2024 under the new agreement. Read more

Southeast Missouri State University

The Department of Agriculture at Southeast Missouri State University has been awarded a \$15,741 Organic Fertilizer and Soil Health Management for Specialty Crops grant from the Missouri Department of Agriculture to evaluate polysulfate as an organic fertilizer for selected early-season and full-season vegetables and as a soil conditioner to improve soil health. Funding comes from the USDA's Specialty Crop Block Grant program. Read more

Western Carolina University (N.C.)

Western Carolina University's (WCU) Rapid Center, a regional source for business and entrepreneurial assistance, will gain some assistance itself in the form of a U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) grant. An EDA University Center Economic Development Program allocation of \$118,000 will support WCU's role in advancing entrepreneurship, innovation and business expansion in Western North Carolina and is the first installment of an expected five-year grant total of \$590,000.
