1. 1.1 The Chair's Announcements:

2. 2.1 Senator Roden announced his intent to raise the following question: Who would I ask a question of about a status report on changing to the semester system?

Associate Vice President Winnick responded: I can respond to that; I can tell you what we know at this point. There was an expectation that there would be funds in the Governor's budget; support for moving to semesters. That didn't happen. That is to say, to my knowledge I have not seen any line-item funds in the budget. That does not preclude the Chancellor from funding the change to semesters. We have expected that to happen, but hasn't happened yet. We have asked about it at the senior officers level, but we have not heard anything. A decision will be made soon; this is being discussed as I said, and we have asked the questions at the senior officers level. We expect that it will happen, we just don't know when. When we get funding from the Chancellor's Office it probably will not be as much as we estimate our costs to be and it would probably be a two-year time frame – we would have two years from the time the decision is made. A decision - if we go or not go - has not come down yet. We have asked that we be told quickly when it does happen – and we expect that it will happen.
