- 5.7 It was agreed by consensus to accept Senator Herr's suggestion as a friendly amendment.
- 5.8 The Koch amendment was approved as amended.
- 5.9 It was m/s/ (Faust) to refer document 04-8 back to the Faculty Policy Committee to consider the questions on the deans' rankings and on the issue of what kind of rank ordering the committee is charged with.
- 5.10 Debate ensued.
- 5.11 The Faust motion was withdrawn.
- 5.12 It was m/s/ (Faust) to amend the third paragraph of document 04-8 by inserting a the following new language after the second sentence: THE COMMITTEE SHALL INDICATE WHICH PROPOSALS ARE HIGHLY RECOMMENDED, RECOMMENDED, AND NOT RECOMMENDED; reinstating the language: IF BECAUSE OF LIMITED FUNDING; and adding: NOT ALL RECOMMENDED PROPOSALS CAN BE FUNDED, THE COMMITTEE SHALL RANK ORDER THE PROPOSALS WITHIN THE RECOMMENDED CATEGORY to replace the language <u>The committee shall develop a rank order of all sabbatical leave applications approved by the committee.</u>
- 5.13 It was m/s/f (Cates) to amend the Faust motion by deleting the phrase If because of limited funding and inserting the words WHEN NECESSARY.
- 5.14 It was m/s/ (Cates) to amend the Faust motion by deleting the phrase If because of limited funding not all recommended proposals can be funded.
- 5.15 Senator Angelo suggested as a friendly amendment that the Cates motion include adding quotation marks around the word "recommended" in both sentences.
- 5.16 It was agreed by consensus to accept the suggestion made by Senator Angelo as a friendly amendment.
- 517 The Cates amendment was approved as amended.
- 5.18 The Faust motion was approved as amended.
- 5.19 It was m/s/f (Cates) to amend document 04-8 by inserting the phrase AND ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE DEANS after the word "rankings" in the first sentence in the first paragraph.
