- 1. 1.1 Chair's Announcements:
  - 1.1.1 Since our last Senate meeting, President Covino has approved the following Senate recommendation:
    - Proposed Policy Modification: The Curriculum Subcommittee, <u>Faculty Handbook</u>, Chapter II, effective Spring 2017.

The Faculty Handbook will be updated to include the approved policy.

- 1.1.2 As mentioned at the last senate meeting, we will be convening the consultative group working on "An Inclusive Campus" in Spring 2017 to work on two important issues, to help address post-election concerns and to review the CSU Ethnic Studies Report. This is one of the 6 Consultative Groups outlined in the Strategic Plan Implementation Structure. The membership of this consultative group working on "An Inclusive Campus" is shown below. Note that Senate will be identifying two at-large faculty representatives for this group. Please consider nominating yourself or one of your colleagues for this important group. Please send information outlining your interest and any relevant expertise to the Academic Senate. A call will also be going out to faculty.
- 1.1.3 The dates for Commencement 2017 have been revised due to an unavoidable scheduling conflict with Chancellor's Office. The new dates for commencement will be Saturday May 20th, Sunday May 21st, and Monday May 22nd. The previous dates, Monday May 22nd through Wednesday May 24th conflict with the Board of Trustee's meeting which President Covino must attend to represent our campus.
- 1.1.4 All faculty and staff are invited to attend a panel that will attempt to answer the question, "How do we talk to our students about the divisive post-election rhetoric and actions?" The panel will consist of David Olsen, Communication Studies; Luz Borjon, Glazer Family Dreamers Resource Center; Talia Bettcher, Philosophy; Aminah Bakeer Abdul-Jabbaar, Pan African Studies; and Mohammad Auwal, Communication Studies. Each member of the panel has a unique perspective on how we can help our students in this time of political division. The hope is that, though it is the final week of the semester, we may be better prepared when spring semester begins, only a few days after the inauguration. - 1.1.5 Provost Mahoney has convened a university LMS Taskforce to do a comprehensive fact-finding and needs analysis of Moodle. In the coming weeks, CETL, in collaboration with the Academic Information Resources Subcommittee (AIRS) of the Academic Senate, will be collecting data on Moodle usage, as well as the LMS needs of faculty, staff and students. These data will be shared widely with the campus community and used to inform further steps.
