These two exceptions are (1) peer- reviewed books and textbooks; and (2) when any faculty authored material has been adopted by departments or programs outside of Cal State LA. During the senate debate about this policy, a senator from NSS proposed an amendment that would have allowed a departmental exception and the amendment was not passed. Our campus policy does not provide an exemption for departmentally-assigned instructional materials."
