Chair Bettcher began with a Tongva land acknowledgement; offered thoughts and prayers to the surviving family and friends as last week was the one year anniversary of the killing of Breonna Taylor, the recent shootings in Atlanta spas that left 8 people dead, and the mass shooting in Boulder, CO that left ten people dead; and reviewed the protocols for participating in Senate meetings and iCloud clicker use.

1. 1.1 Chair's announcements:
1.1.1 On March 19, 2021, President Covino approved the following recommendation: Modification: Definition, Philosophy, Student Learning Outcomes and Criteria for General Education Breadth Requirements, Faculty Handbook, Chapter IV effective immediately
The Faculty Handbook has been updated to reflect the changes.
1.1.2 An email went out last Friday that I wanted to bring to your attention: All Cal State LA employees who received COVID-19 vaccinations through the online appointment system set up by the University should refer to their vaccination card for the date of the second appointment.
