Open letter to the Academic Senate of Cal State LA, CSU Board of Trustees, Chancellor Jolene Koester and Cal State LA President William A Covino

Read aloud on May 10, 2022 by Senator Leda Ramos during Cal State LA Academic Senate Meeting

To whom it may concern:

I condemn the actions by the Administration at Cal State LA and the Pat Brown Institute for Public Affairs that would so brutally treat the esteemed Cal State LA Professor and scholar and activist Dr. Melina Abdullah at the Mayoral debate event last May Day. The forced removal of Dr. Melina Abdullah, esteemed Cal State LA Professor, scholar, and activist from the Mayoral debate is absolutely unacceptable. These actions taken by campus police officers did nothing to secure the safety of event attendees, but instead humiliated and criminalized a beloved member of Cal State LA faculty. In turn, these actions have not only traumatized Dr. Melina Abdullah, but have also traumatized those students, faculty, staff, and community members in attendance. It is absolutely unacceptable to treat a Black-woman and all women in such a terrorizing manner. Further, such terrorism of any community member engaging in the political process is inappropriate and unreasonable.

Dr. Abdullah, my heart goes out to you and your family. You are seen, recognized and we demand accountability.

President William A. Covino, you are responsible for the legacy of anti-blackness on this campus. Anti-blackness is indicative of your leadership and is no longer acceptable. In the summer of 2020, I shared support for Dr. Abdullah at a Press conference held at Cal State LA when you overlooked her application as Inaugural Dean of the College of Ethnic Studies even though we know of her foundational work to create the College of Ethnic Studies and work with the Ethnic Studies AB1460 bill that is now law in large part to Dr. Abdullah's leadership. The anti-Blackness and violence to Cal State LA faculty and students must stop now. We are all deserving of equity, and dignity.
