## **Management Option**

Important Pre-requisite classes MGMT 3060, 3070 and 3080

Take MGMT 3070, MGMT 3060 and MGMT 3080 as soon as possible in your 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> semester

Don't wait to start your option classes

Begin your required and elective option classes as soon as pre-requisites are met and work them in with your business core (this contradicts the catalog which lists MGMT courses last in the list of core courses)

Take MGMT 4500 as a required course only

MGMT 4500 is incorrectly listed as an elective in the Management option in the catalog – it is a required course and does not double count as both required and elective
