Dean's Message

Welcome to Fall Semester 2017

Here it is again, the start of another Fall term! As you read this, you are moving from that summer zone into the much faster paced start of an academic year. I hope that your summer was filled with many good things---a time to rest, relax and recharge. And that now you're nearly ready and set to get started!

We've had a busy summer in the CCOE.

- Phase I of faculty office upgrades was successfully completed. We thank all who participated, and Rosa and Facility Services for their efforts!
- Two task forces were formed and worked throughout the summer: one on "The Way Forward" for academic program offerings in the CCOE; the other worked on important curricular changes and alignments for Urban Learning (Early Subject Matter Waiver, Response to EO 1071 with development of a third option to accelerate the degree + credential into four years).

- We got ready to welcome three faculty to the College. We saw a few staff members move on into other opportunities and we welcomed two new staff.
- The CCOE hosted or co-sponsored **five** events since Commencement: "Crossing Fictive Borders" Symposium (June); with the Urban Education Leadership Collaborative at Columbia Teachers College, an Institute on "School Transformation for Inclusion" (June); the Annual Summer Conference of the California Counseling Association (July); the Third Annual California Teachers Summit (July-we were one of over 25 sites); and the 30th Annual Satellites in Education Conference (July).
- Over 250 children and youth found their way to Cal State LA for the "Reading Camp" and "Writing Camp"; and we also hosted a visit to campus by 80 African-American children and youth of the "Genius Project."
- Several teams from the CCOE (Faculty, Administrators and Staff) attended conferences. Some examples are: the TeachLIVE Annual Conference (which provided research on use of this VR tool in educator preparation); CSU Center for the Advancement of Linked Learning; National Association of Foreign Student Advisors Annual Conference; The Summer meeting of the Carnegie Project on the Education Doctorate and the CSU Ed Deans Summer Meeting.
- The Grants Resource Center welcomed Dr. Costello Brown, who will be leading the center through the end of November.
- LAUTR brought in a new cohort of 19 students and moved these students through orientation and summer coursework. These courses were in addition to the handful of other courses taught by CCOE faculty this summer.
- The Office of Student Services hosted one freshman orientation and two transfer orientation sessions (for ULRN and Rehab Services undergraduates). A credential orientation session for students entering teaching credential programs this fall was held as well.

And this list is not exhaustive. Many of you participated in summer conferences (with travel to some very exciting places), focused on your research and scholarship agenda, offered professional development for practioners and so forth!

Please let the Senior Leadership Team or your Division Chair know how we can assist as you start up this Fall Semester, doing that important work to prepare education professionals to meet the needs of children, youth, and families of Los Angeles! Rock on!

If ICE Agents Show Up At Your Door:

- Don't open the door, but be calm. You have rights.
- Ask what they are there for, (and ask for an interpreter if you need one).
- If they ask to enter, ask if they have a warrant signed by a judge* and if so, ask to see it (through a window or slipped under the door).
- If they do NOT have a warrant signed by a judge*, you may refuse to let them in. Ask them to leave any information at your door.
- If they force their way in, don't resist. Tell everyone in the residence to remain silent.
- If you are arrested, remain silent and do not sign anything until you speak to a lawyer.

*An ICE administrative warrant (form I-200, I-205) does not allow them to enter your home without your consent.

This will be the first total solar eclipse to touch the U.S. mainland since 1979 and the first to cross from coast to coast since 1918



The partial eclipse will last between two and three hours, and the total eclipse (within the path) will last just under three minutes



Tens of millions of people will experience total eclipse, while hundreds of millions more will see the partial eclipse



The next total solar eclipse in the U.S. will occur on April 8, 2024

THE AMERICAN OPTOMETRIC ASSOCIATION (AOA) OFFERS THESE TIPS TO SAFELY VIEW THE CELESTIAL EVENT OF THE DECADE:

DON'T look directly at the sun without eye protection, even briefly, except during total totality



DO consider purchase of specially made 'eclipse glasses' or other ISO-certified filters



DON'T use sunglasses, photographic film, neutral density filters, smoked glass or other materials
