- 1.1 S. Cash welcomed back all returning committee members. Introductions were held.
- 1.2 A. Gonzalez announced that a memo was sent to all department chairs describing the recent changes in Title V reducing the minimum number of units required for the bachelor's degree to 180. A fast track approval process is available for programs that elect to reduce units to 180 through the reduction of free elective units. All departments must respond to the memo by January 31st.
- 1.3 A. Gonzalez announced that S. Cash has been appointed the GE Assessment Program Coordinator for the campus.
- 1.4 A. Gonzalez announced that the Office of Undergraduate Studies is currently accepting applications for an Associate Dean for General Education and Articulation and for the Faculty Director for the University Writing Center.
- 1.5 A. Gonzalez reported that the ad hoc Service Learning Curriculum Development Committee met and approved 10 awards for course proposals that will incorporate service learning into the curriculum. Additional money is available and a call for proposals will be going out shortly.
