Pandemic Diaries Project

Faculty Submission Guideline

1. CONSENT STATEMENT

As you develop your assignment prompt, ensure that students understand the purpose and parameters of the Pandemic Diaries project:

Students are being asked to participate in the Cal State LA Pandemic Dairies Project designed by Azalea Camacho, Archivist and Special Collections Librarian, and Jamie Zeffery, Digitization Projects Assistant, of the University Library Special Collections and Archives at Cal State LA. The purpose of this project is to document stories, narratives, and experiences of how our campus community is being affected during the COVID-19 pandemic. The digital dairies will serve as a historical record and will be stored in perpetuity in the Cal State LA archives. By creating these historical records and preserving them we can provide a first-hand account of our community for future generations.

Students are being asked to conduct a self-interview with a video or audio recording device of your choice using the provided questions as your guide. This self-interview may be recorded in the location of your choice and should be no longer than 1 hour. Students do not have to answer any questions they do not feel comfortable answering. Students will be asked to state their name in the recording, but if they choose to remain anonymous, they may use a pseudonym as well as conduct an audio-only recording. The recording submitted will be made available to the public for research through the Cal State LA Library digital archive and may also be used in public displays or exhibits.
