1. The above roadmap is a SAMPLE schedule. Please ensure that you meet with the department's undergraduate advisor to plan your actual schedule.
2. All CSULA students must complete two diversity courses (d), of which one must focus on race and ethnicity (re). Consult an adviser for help in selecting these courses.
3. All CSULA students must complete two writing intensive courses (wi). English majors fulfill this requirement by taking ENGL 2900 and a senior seminar (ENGL 4910, 4920, or 4925).
4. All CSULA students must complete two civic learning/community engagement courses (cl). Transfer students with GE certification are only required to complete one civic learning/community engagement course, which should be taken as one of the upper division general education (UD GE) courses.
5. The introductory sequence of ENGL courses is as follows: ENGL 2900—ENGL 3xxx (six Core Readings courses).
6. Senior standing (90 or more units completed) is required to enroll in the required senior seminar (ENGL 4910, 4920, or 4925).
7. The above roadmap only identifies requirements for upper division General Education (9 units) and the English major (49 units). Transfer students might need to enroll in additional free electives to accumulate the 120 units necessary for graduation.
